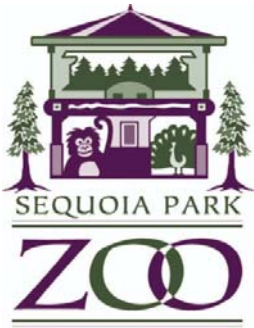
ZOO SCAVENGER HUNT

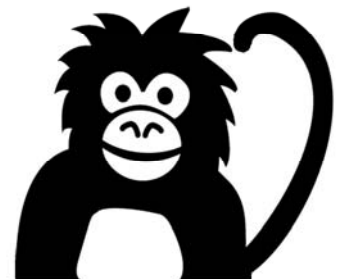
